It is the highest level of recognition the Ohio tourism industry bestows. The men and women who have received this award are respected leaders for their outstanding accomplishments within Ohio's tourism industry. These leaders contribute to voluntary tourism membership organizations, mentor and encourage new industry professionals, and participate in civic and community affairs. They exemplify the best in our industry by believing in and continually promoting Ohio as a destination.

Paul Sherlock Award Call for Nominations

Eligibility and Points

Regarded as an exceptional and inspirational role model by professional peers	20 points
Outstanding contributions to creating growth of Ohio tourism through innovation, astute business practices, and/or development of new approaches	20 points
Dedication to advancing tourism in Ohio beyond that required by his or her professional position	20 points
Commitment to creating widespread support and understanding of the importance of the travel economy	20 points
Proven leadership at local, regional, state or national levels	10 points
History of distinguished service to Ohio's tourism industry that spans no less than 10 years	10 points

Nomination Procedure

You may nominate **ONE** respected professional for the Paul Sherlock Award by mailing or faxing the attached nomination form to the OTA Paul Sherlock Award Committee, Dan Hostetler, Chair, c/o Ohio Travel Association by **Aug. 27, 2015.** (Self nominations are not accepted.) Nomination packets can also be emailed to Melinda Huntley at mhuntley@ohiotravel.org. Please send all documents in one pdf.

In order to facilitate the awards judging and to establish equitable judging conditions, the Nomination Form must be completed and returned with supporting material. You are limited to **only two (2) single-spaced**, typewritten attachment pages (8 1/2" x 11") to address the six points of eligibility criteria identified above. The committee members will place relatively more emphasis on the information contained on the nomination form and the **quality** of the supporting material – as opposed to the **quantity**.

Supporting materials documenting the above eligibility criteria may earn up to **twenty (20) points**. For uniformity and ease of judging, they should be presented in an **8 1/2" x 11" format**. <u>Please limit supporting material to four (4) pages</u>. Photocopies or tear sheets of printed material are preferred. All submissions are to be as brief as possible. Where possible, supporting material should be organized in a notebook or binder.

Recognition of Winner

The 2015 Paul Sherlock Award winner will be honored at the opening night gala of the 2015 Ohio Conference on Tourism, Nov. 16, 2015 at the Hilton Polaris/Columbus. The award presentation is a conference highlight, and the winner will receive appropriate recognition for his/her outstanding work.

The award winner will be featured on the OTA website and will be publicized statewide and to the travel industry trade publications.
