# Paul Sherlock Award Call for Nominations

## Eligibility

- Full-time employment within Ohio's tourism industry for at least five years; **5 points**
  - Have been active in the Ohio Travel Association and/or other tourism-related organizations for at least three years; **15 points**
  - Proven leadership in promoting all areas of Ohio beyond that required by their professional position; **20 points**
  - Have provided time, talent and continual counsel to tourism professionals enabling them to show consistent growth within the industry; **20 points**
  - Proven leadership in unifying Ohio's tourism community – **IN SHORT, NOMINEE SHOULD BE AN ACTIVE AMBASSADOR FOR OHIO TOURISM. 20 points**

## Nomination Procedure

You may nominate **ONE** respected professional for the Paul Sherlock Award by mailing or faxing the attached nomination form to the OTA Paul Sherlock Award Committee, Dan Hostetler, Chair, c/o Ohio Travel Association by **August 13, 2010**. (Self nominations are not accepted.)

In order to facilitate the awards judging and to establish equitable judging conditions, the Nomination Form must be completed and returned with supporting material. You may include **only two (2) single-spaced**, typewritten attachment pages (**8 1/2" x 11"**) addressing the five points of eligibility criteria. The committee members will place relatively more emphasis on the information contained on the nomination form and the **quality** of the supporting material – as opposed to the **quantity**.

Supporting materials documenting the above eligibility criteria may earn up to twenty (20) points. For uniformity and ease of judging, they should be presented in an **8 1/2" x 11" format**. **Please limit supporting material to three (3) pages**. Photocopies or tear sheets of printed material are preferred. All submissions are to be as brief as possible. Where possible, supporting material should be organized in a notebook or binder.
